
THE "GOLDEN RULE" SAILS NEAR US

The Golden Rule boat, crewed mainly by Quakers, sailed in the late 1950's to the Marshall Islands to protest nuclear bomb testing in that area. One of the crew members was George Willoughby of Central Philadelphia Meeting. Recovered from disrepair in 2010, a major repair and restore project has brought it back to seaworthyness and today the Golden Rule sails again, with the same message, the danger of nuclear weapons. She is currently sailing a Great Loop from Chicago to Miami and back, the crew meeting with thousands of people along the route. It's very exciting that she will be docked in Philadelphia May 9-14.

The Golden Rule is now a project of Veterans for Peace and I was fortunate to meet the newly elected president of Veterans for Peace in Honolulu and learn of the return of Golden Rule. Former Trenton Meeting attender Allan Willinger and his wife Jo Schlessinger were the houseparents of the Honolulu Quaker Meetinghouse (which also includes guest rooms) in 2018 when I visited.

Our Peace and Social Concern Committee (PSCC) has been donating a modest amount occasionally to support this worthwhile and amazing endeavor. Our donations have allotted us more than one "plank" which are each commemorated with a certificate as shown below.

SPRING WORK DAY AT THE MEETINGHOUSE

Trenton Friends came together on Saturday, April 29, 2023 for our annual Spring Work Day – the first after several years during the pandemic.

We opened with a brief time of worship, in which one Friend spoke out of the silence, saying that this workday itself felt like a meeting for worship.

In the Meeting Room and in our social room, some folks spent hours washing windows, cleaning historic lighting fixtures, and installing new energy-saving light bulbs.

Among the dirtiest jobs of the day was that tackled by the folks cleaning the cellar — sweeping up dirt and sorting through countless items for what is still being used, what ought to be kept for future generations, and that which could be contributed to Trenton Meeting's up-coming Free Sale. Among the more interesting discoveries were a pair of wooden skis with leather straps (did an early Friend ski to Meeting for Worship one day?), the tell-tale signs of a old flue-fire from the period when the Meetinghouse was heated with a coal furnace, and we found the source of a rain water leak periodically flooding the basement floor.

Friends working outside enjoyed getting wet in the light rain. One of the teams collected bags and bags of trash and recycling from the area adjoining our grounds and the seemingly abandoned property next door. Other Friends installed our new rain barrel which was in place just in time for filling up in the next day's storm. Trenton Meeting purchased the rain barrel towards environmental sustainability and, on a practical level, to help water the Hanover side flower garden. And, our Peace Pole started getting new signs — replacing a couple that were deteriorating after almost 20 years and (when the job is done) adding Polish, Creole, Russian and Swahili to the English, Spanish, Hebrew and Arabic already there.

Kilpack, 1914-1999

The understanding of Quakers is that the Light within, often called God or Spirit, is in all of us - all of humanity. It is not at a distance awaiting our pleas. It gives us a responsibility to act to bring forth the work of God or Spirit in pursuit of a world of justice, peace and equality. The quote above is from the William Penn Lecture delivered by Gilbert H. Kilpack at Arch Street Meeting House in 1946. While the lecture was a reflection on the Atomic Bomb being unleashed, for the first time ever, on the people of Hiroshima, this quote reminds us that a good heart and good intentions must be accompanied by voices raised and actions taken to create positive change. In current circumstances of world and local need we have many reasons and many ways to call ourselves to action.

Quaker history includes proud moments of actions that pushed forward equality, justice, environmental stewardship and peace. If you are already part of our community you know our legacy and are aware of the actions available under Quaker leadership.
