<u>What is a Quaker</u>

On February 18, members of the Religious Education Committee met for an "inservice" where we went through an internal process to explore what it means to be a Quaker. It was an interesting experience to discover where our similarities and differences lay. Believe it or not, we did find some areas of agreement.

The intention had been to explore what a Quaker is in order to contemplate how to help children understand and experience Quakerism. However, we ended up thinking that we would like to do this with more people, and that maybe it might help us to explain Quakerism to adults as well.

<u>Planning a Young Adult Oriented "Pop Up"</u>

Anie Mickey and Cathy Campbell attended the Princeton Seminary's "Collaboratory" seminar this past month. We had no idea what to expect, and it turned out to be nothing we could have expected. The Trenton Meeting has agreed to work with Princeton Seminary to create a pop up event somewhere in Trenton for encountering young adults (basically 23 to 29 year olds). As far as we know, The Princeton Seminary also did not know what they were getting when they accepted us into the program. Many fellow attendees were intrigued by our discussions of Quakerism and welcomed the ideas that we shared, which made it extra fun for us.

The Seminary will provide \$500 to fund our "pop up" project. The project's goal is to use a new set of tools we were given to learn about the surrounding community and to get to know young adults in our community. The pop up should take place in May. We were surprised to find out that it is to take place somewhere other than on our Meeting property. There is not a high expectation that we will be "successful", and there is not even a clear idea of what our goal is!
