WHAT IS A TRENTON QUAKER



Recently we have begun an exploration of the values, feelings and actions that make us "Trenton Quakers". The Religious Society of Friends (Quaker) is built on several important "basics" such as peace, equality and simplicity. Local Meetings are guided by the traditional foundations of the religion, but each Quaker community finds and builds an individual identity that is the result of the perceived needs inside and outside the Meeting and the collective leading of Spirit.

Trenton Friends participated in several opportunities to answer the "what is a Trenton Quaker" question by considering several topics. Folks provided a word or phrase that represented their individual response to each topic in connection to themselves and the Meeting. Using this list of submitted words and phrases, each person emphasized the ones that most mirrored their experience or belief. A "word cloud" has been created for each of the topics.

This month we look at the results of "Trenton Quaker Feelings". The submitted words and phrases appear in the image in sizes relative to the number of us for whom it felt important. "Compassionate" and "Grounded & Open-Minded" hit the top and are reflections of the warmth of our Meeting community and of our loving connection each other and to the non-Quaker community around us.

SKILL TO SUCCEED (A MEN FOR HOPE PROGRAM)





Community Investment Committee met with Kelvin Baldwin, a quiet hero of Trenton. Pastor, mentor, carpenter and contractor, Pastor Baldwin brought a us a proposal for a new program for training and employing young men and women. Men for H.O.P.E., led by Baldwin with Britton Thomas and Damon Norman, has been doing the work of training, mentoring and educating young folks for more than a decade, touching lives throughout the city.




The new initiative, part of their Skillls to Succeed program, will be training young folks to operate and/or work effectively in a small business. The model will be laundry services where every aspect of business including facility, customer service, business records, etc. will be covered. Our grant will help with purchasing the washers and dryers and the stipends for trainees in Skills to Succeed programs.

After a long incarceration for youthful misdeeds, he has established a philanthropic organization that focuses on tech for youth who do not get the robust education in the tech fields that students in the suburbs do. He sought from us a grant to bring an additional year of Girls Who Code to the

<u> Quaker Walk 2025 - Nyc to Dc</u>

A group of Quakers from Brooklyn Monthly Meeting, walking from New York City to Washington, DC stopped at Trenton Meeting on May 8th for lunch, fellowship and a brief rest. They are traveling with a messages from the 1600s and today to Congress and the administration. The impetus for this walk comes from the current state of affairs that threatens friends and neighbors from abroad, and the existence of a document known as "The Flushing Remonstrance". This





document records the protest and grievances (remonstrance) of citizens of Flushing in New York (then New Amsterdam) to Governor Stuyvesant regarding a decree targeting Quakers arriving in the area. It is a strong statement of conscience regarding the treatment of all persons arriving amongst us from afar.
